


The labour market today: strong employment growth masks a more complex story

Youth unemployment in Melbourne's west – *an increase of 8% since June 2020* (more than double the State-wide average increase)

Long-term unemployed

29%

of unemployed people are now classified as long term unemployed (looking for work for over 12 months) – the **largest share in over 20 years**

Delivered by a new, state-wide workforce, Jobs Victoria supports people looking for work with free employment advice, support to get job-ready, and career counselling so they can prepare for and secure work.







Jobs Victoria Advocates support Victorians looking for work in their local communities to connect them with information, support and training. Jobs Victoria Mentors help people to become workready, find a job that suits them, and support them in their role for the first six months. Jobs Victoria Career Counsellors provide career guidance to people who are looking for work, want more work, or are seeking a career change.

Jobs Victoria Partners work with local employers to identify their labour needs. They connect employers to candidates with the right skills and attitude.





Jobs Victoria Fund

The \$250 million Jobs Victoria Fund is creating steady and secure jobs for Victorians.

Wage subsidies

- Small-medium sized businesses can receive wage subsidies of up to \$20,000 to employ someone impacted by the pandemic.
- Jobs must be at least 12 months in duration and not casual.
- At least 60 per cent of jobs will be for women (including \$50m for women over 45 years).
- Other priority jobseekers include young people and people who are long-term unemployed.





Jobs Victoria Fund (Wage Subsidies) Eligibility Criteria

Jobseekers	Employers
 Level 1 wage subsidy (\$20,000 / 1.0 FTE pro-rata) Women over 45 Long-term unemployed people (6+ months) 	Any employer can apply if they have a Victorian address, an ABN or ACN, and hold WorkCover insurance.
 Jobseekers registered with a Jobs Victoria Partner Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people People with disability 	This is except for Victorian Public Service, Australian Public Service, Commonwealth and Victorian public sector entities.
 People seeking asylum/refugees Newly arrived migrants from non-English speaking backgrounds. 	Businesses must also have payroll of less than \$20 million in the preceding financial year.
	Jobs must:
Level 2 wage subsidy (\$10,000 /1.0 FTE pro-rata)	 be for a minimum of 12 months
Young people under 25	 not displace existing employees
People over 45 yearsVeterans	 be permanent or fixed term for at least 19 hours per week (casual jobs are ineligible)
 People previously employed under the Working for Victoria initiative. 	 provide at least legal minimum wages and entitlements as specified in the applicable award, enterprise agreement or National Employment Standards
Employers must hire new staff from the priority groups before they apply. Staff must have started their new role from 16 March 2021 (inclusive).	 not exceed a full-time salary / wages of \$120,000 per annum.



Jobs Victoria Fund - Important information

Criteria apply for jobseekers, employers and the type of jobs:

- Applications are now open
- New staff must have started their new role from 16 March 2021 (inclusive)
- Employers must hire new staff from the priority groups before they apply
- Employers must apply within 12 weeks of new employee(s) commencing their employment.
- The Jobs Victoria online hub can assist with recruitment of priority jobseekers
- Employers can apply as many times as they like
- Assessments will commence in the order applications are submitted
- The Fund remains open until it is exhausted.
