Appointment of a proxy

A Member entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint another person as their proxy. The proxy need not be a Member of the Company.

Chairperson voting undirected proxies

If the Chairperson is your proxy, the Chairperson will cast your vote in accordance with your directions on the Proxy Form. If you do not include any directions on your Proxy Form, then you expressly authorise the Chairperson to vote your undirected proxy at his discretion.

Explanatory Notes to Resolutions

Annual General Meeting Agenda Item 5 – Financial Reports

The Corporations Act 2001 requires the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Independent Auditors' Report to be laid before the Annual General Meeting.

Members will be provided with an opportunity at the AGM to ask questions in relation to these reports via the online platform AGM.

Agenda Item 6 – Appointment of officeholders

In accordance with clause 42.4 of the Company's constitution, Directors serve on a three year rotational basis. One-third are require to stand down at each AGM in accordance with clause 42.1(b) of the Company's constitution.

As such, Founding Directors Matt Pfahlert, Lachlann Carter and Cinnamon Evens are retiring. Matt Pfahlert and Lachlann Carter will not seek re-election.

Cinnamon Evans is eligible for re-election in accordance with clause 42.5 of the Company's constitution and is seeking re-election.

Cinnamon Evans

Cinnamon brings 30-years' experience and leadership expertise in the not-for-profit and social enterprise sectors. She is SENVIC's inaugural Chair and CEO of <u>CERES</u>, <u>Centre for Education and Research in Environmental Strategies</u>, an award winning, not-for-profit, sustainability centre and urban farm located on 4.5 hectares in Melbourne's inner north.

CERES is home to multiple social enterprises including: a market, an organic grocery, cafés, a community kitchen, an organic online supermarket, a sustainable timber supplier, a permaculture and bushfood nursery and is one of the largest sustainability education providers in Victoria.

Cinnamon is particularly passionate about the role of social enterprise in delivering environmental and social change, having experienced first-hand the transformative power of this movement. She is skilled in group facilitation, holding space and public speaking and has formal tertiary qualifications in education and environmental science. She has also studied collaborative management and group facilitation, and has provided community engagement and facilitation services to the not-for-profit, government and industry sectors.

Cinnamon is a member of Moora Moora Co-operative Community, a residential, off-grid, eco-village in the Yarra Ranges. She is a student of yoga philosophy and practices asana (postures) and kirtan (chanting) as regularly as possible.

The Board recommends the following by ordinary resolution:

The directors have determined the two vacancies will be filled by the recommendations of the People and Culture Committee established in accordance with the Constitution.

Report of the People and Culture Committee (PCC)

The PCC is established by the Board in accordance with the Company's Constitution.

The Committee's purpose is to oversee and make recommendations to the Board in it's consideration of matters of strategic Human Resources and organisational culture. The areas covered by the PCC include (but not limited to) recruitment, retention, care and support of SENVIC's people, professional development and appraisal systems. The PCC's responsibilities include oversight of Board membership, recruitment, skills development and succession planning.

Following a three-week public promotion and call for applicants, the PCC selected the following candidates for appointment as a Director of SENVIC Ltd:

Alyson Skinner

Alyson is Manager of the Venus Bay Community Centre and for the past 18 months has been a member of the <u>Gippsland Social Enterprise Collective</u>, SENVIC's Gippsland Local Lead to establish a network of existing and emerging social entrepreneurs in Gippsland. Alyson has been an active leader in the Collective, providing input and liaison to SENVIC and working with the team to provide appropriate learning and development opportunities to regional Victoria.

As Manager of the <u>Venus Bay Community Centre</u>, Alyson established the <u>Community Recycling Enterprise</u> and continues to experiment with other community enterprises that strengthen community resilience and local engagement.

Alyson has extensive board and committee experience including with Neighbourhood Houses Gippsland and was a former elected Councillor of South Gippsland Shire Council. Alyson is currently participating in the inaugural <u>SENVIC Social Enterprise</u> <u>Leaders Fellowship</u>. She has a positive and vibrant personality and will bring a valuable regional perspective to Board deliberations.

Nathaniel is an award-winning speaker, innovator and leading authority in the Future of Education. As CEO of <u>Future Minds Network</u>, he's delivered career-readiness programs in schools and universities world-wide. Today, the social enterprise has taught thousands of students to build their own businesses and harness entrepreneurial skills like creativity for the future workplace. The social enterprise has empowered students to create innovative solutions tackling the UNs SDGs and has donated over \$100,000 in programs to help young people in disadvantaged communities find employment, practice technical skills and prototype apps from their living room.

2021 Young Australian of the Year finalist, Nathaniel is an international startup mentor and Giant in Residence at Blackbird – Australia's leading venture capital firm. He helps early-stage startups streamline their marketing & comms, strategic plans and measure

impact to land corporate partners. Nathaniel also sits on the Advisory Board of SparkTeen, alongside the former CEO of Techstars.

Through immersive workshops and keynotes, Nathaniel helps young people unlock their endless creativity. He helps corporates, NGOs and educational institutions leverage the potential of Gen-Z, harness innovation and the Future of Work. An international speaker, Nathaniel is a regular MC, moderator and guest presenter at Monash University, TEDx, and more: nathanieldiong.com.
